

How can I add partner / funder / specific programme information to a badge?

Lots of Badge Nation badges recognise activities and programmes that are partnered with, or funded by, other organisations to the issuer writing the badge. If you would like to feature a partner or funder there are a few different options to explore, you could include one or all of the following:

Feature partner / funder / specific programme in the badge long title

When submitting your badge using the Google form, you can add this information to the long title.

Choose a type of activity that best describes this criteria. This will be represented by a small icon so does not need to be exact.

2. Criteria Description, add the text you wish you appear.

Criteria 1 (Description) *

Describe each important element of the activity or achievement the individual has undertaken in detail. Start the description with 'Earner has', write in the past tense. 500 characters maximum. Your Criteria description needs to reference the skills, knowledge, attitudes or values the earner has gained or demonstrated during the activity. These will feature as skills tags in the badge.
